## New Year - things to hear and play:

 The Vienna Philharmonic's iconic New Year's Concert from the Golden Hall of the Musicverein will go ahead (without an audience) on New Year's Day conducted by Riccardo Muti. Find it on BBC 2 and Radio 3 from 10.15am, and thereafter on BBC iPlayer and BBC Sounds.



- An Epiphany Organ Meditation from Peterborough Cathedral will be played by Chris Strange, the Cathedral Organist, at 6pm on Sunday 3rd January. Featuring Gigout's Rhapsodie sur des Nöels and the Dubois March of The Three Kings it can be found on at <u>Peterborough Cathedral - YouTube</u>.
- York Minster will have Lessons and Carols for Epiphany on 6th January at 5.30pm at YorkMinster.org.
- A New Year Spectacular from the Westerkerk, Amsterdam by Evan Bogerd is on Saturday, 9th January at 6pm at <u>LIVE - Nieuwjaarsconcert - New Year's Recital Evan Bogerd - Westerkerk Amsterdam - YouTube</u>
- Faith in Music is an excellent Radio 4 series in which James Macmillan considers the life and faith of four composers Thomas Tallis, Edward Elgar, Richard Wagner and Leonard Bernstein. The four episodes can be found online on BBC Sounds through the programme website at <u>BBC Radio 4 Faith in Music</u>.
- Still with Radio 4, John Wesley and Methodism is a discussion led by Melvyn Bragg on John Wesley's role in the 18th century religious revival which brought us so many well-loved hymns. It can be found at <u>BBC Radio</u> <u>4 - In Our Time, John Wesley and Methodism</u>.
- For those who may particularly enjoy Charles Wesley's hymns, you may like to consider a collection of almost 100 favourite hymns, many not now included regularly in hymnals but much-loved, in an excellent volume of Wesley Hymns published by Hinde St Chapel in London. The hymnal can be had for £18 including p&p from Wesley Hymns - Hinde Street Methodist Church.
- **Online and physical recitals** are now listed at <u>organrecitals.com</u>. Physical audiences are not permitted for events in Tier 4, which now includes Northamptonshire.

**Sad News.** We note with great sadness that **Catherine Ennis**, DoM of St Lawrence Jewry in the City, former President of both the IAO and the RCO, passed away on Christmas Eve. With the deaths earlier in the year of **Jennifer Bate** and **Jane Parker-Smith**, the organ world will mourn the loss of these three iconic organists.

John Wilson, immediate Past President (and first Virtual President) of NDOA reports that he has been involved in three recent musical events at local churches that involved the masked congregation humming while a small sociallydistanced choir sang hymns. John advises he is thinking of writing an article for the Newsletter called 'Hums Ancient and Modern' (gettit?) but these few lines will do for now. The first event was on 6th December at Harrington Parish Church, as part of the Music at Harrington series organised by Benedict and Katherine Cadbury. Ian Clarke played the 2-manual tracker organ (which we hope to visit in April) and a 6-person choir sang, with the audience humming the carols. Then at Sulgrave Parish Church on 20th December, John played the Binns organ for the annual Carol Concert. His daughter Rosanne sang duos with a local soprano and again the congregation hummed along. There have been humming choruses also at SS Peter & Paul in Kettering for Lessons and Carols, and for Christingle, and no doubt elsewhere in our district during the festive season. Let's hope the voices can sing out loud and clear in our churches before too long!

The Book of Common Prayer **Collect for St John the Evangelist** (this year transferred by the Church of England to 29th December) with its call for enlightenment, seems particularly apposite to follow up John Wilson's fervent hope:

MERCIFUL Lord, we beseech thee to cast thy bright beams of light upon thy Church, that it being enlightened by the doctrine of thy blessed Apostle and Evangelist Saint John may so walk in the light of thy truth, that it may at length attain to the light of everlasting life; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.
