Thank you to everyone who supported Peterborough's Summer Series, whether by attending, staffing our stand, or preparing for the recitals. We are delighted to have been able to support the series for a second time and offer a particularly big thank you to Chris Strange, Peterborough's Acting DoM, Adam Heron, the 24-25 Organ Scholar, and Sarah Collister, the Music Department Administrator. The eight recitals in the series have offered a tremendous variety of music and attracted increasing audiences.

NDOA President's BBQ. Thank you also to our President, Tony Edwards, for hosting our BBQ last month, which was greatly enjoyed by everyone who attended.

August Bank Holiday Monday - visit to three iconic organs in the Oundle Area. We are delighted to present an opportunity to visit three very different - but iconic - organs in and around Oundle on August Bank Holiday Monday, 25th August. We meet at Glapthorn at 10.30am where we can see and play the one-manual 1937 Roger Yates organ in St Leonard's church. Roger Yates built ground-breaking organs in the organ reform movement style many years ahead of their time, and the Glapthorn organ is an early example with a fascinating history.

Moving to Oundle, we visit St Peter's church - Oundle parish church - which now houses an excellent example of the later work of Northamptonshire organ builder George Holdich. The organ, from a former hospital chapel in London, was completely restored and moved to Oundle in late 2023 by the Norfolk organ builder Richard Bower, who has had a special interest in Holdich organs for many years. Richard Bower has also written a excellent detailed account of the St Peter's organ in the Institute of Organ Building's latest annual publication Organ Building. You can buy the publication from IBO directly at £21.50 plus delivery at The Institute of British Organ Building.

Some 13,000 people turned out for Anna's recent concert in Cologne!

Proms: Rachel Mahon - DoM at Coventry - will also be at the organ of the Royal Albert Hall for a performance of the Saint-Saëns organ symphony as part of this year's Proms series on Thursday 28th August at 7.30pm. Tickets from Proms - BBC. You may have heard Rachel playing Bach on Radio 3 live as a prelude to the opening night of the Proms.

Sunday Worship - the King of Instruments. One of the July editions of BBC Radio 4's Sunday Worship came from the St Alban's International Organ Festival and celebrated the organ as the King of Instruments. It featured music by Peter Hurford, the Festival's founder, and an interview with the organist Margaret Philipps. Available to listen on demand until 4th August at Sunday Worship.
